- 1) You must pay a one-time \$10 registration fee.
- 2) You must compete in 3 out of 4 the shows to qualify for the Buckle Series.
 - 3) There shall be 6 buckle series award categories:

English 17 & Under	English 18 & Over
Western 17 & Under	Western 18 & Over
Ranch 17 & Under	Ranch 18 & Over
- 4) Each show establishes the classes that makeup these categories. These classes may vary from show to show. Refer to the individual show rules for further details.
- 5) Points are accrued based on a horse/rider combination and are not transferable to another combination.
- 6) The combination with the highest point totals of 3 out of 4 shows will be used to determine the Buckle Series champion.
- 7) There must be a minimum of 2 qualified combinations per category competing in order to receive the series award.
 - 8) Ties will be broken by random draw.

2024 SPRING STAMPEDE HORSE SHOW RULES, POLICIES AND NOTES

Show is judged according to the West Coast Horse Show Rulebook, except where noted below. Copies are available online at californiastatehorsemen.org.

Age of Horse or Rider is as of January 1st.

All person, whether showing or not, must sign a release form before handling a horse or riding on event grounds.

English competitors may ride in Hunt or Saddle Seat.

All English riders must wear an ASTM approved hunt cap or helmet with the harness securely fastened when competing. Saddle Seat riders are exempted. Helmets must be worn when jumping. Helmets are acceptable for Western riders.

Western Bit Rules: Horses 5 yrs and younger are allowed to be ridden two handed in a snaffle bit, hackamore, or bosal.

Horses 6 yrs and older must be ridden one handed in a standard western bit. Exception: Green Horse/Rider competitors in their first or second year of showing.

Lead Line Classes: Riders must have lead ropes connected to halters that are either over or under the bridle/headstall. Rider's feet must be in stirrups. Handlers must be 13 years or older.

Reining classes are to be ridden and judged under NRHA rules and patterns.

Ranch Horse classes are designed to show the overall ability of the horse to perform skills necessary to those of an all-around ranch horse. Horses traveling excessively slow and not exhibiting clear gaits will be penalized. Judges are looking for a more naturally looking forward-moving horse.

Awards: Prizes to 1st place, Ribbons 1st to 6th place. Points awarded up to 6th place only.

Daily High Point: High Point awards and/or prizes will only be given for categories with two or more riders competing.

Points are for horse and rider/handler combination. Except where noted, Ties will be broken in the following order: 1) most firsts; 2) most firsts with the fewest number of total classes; 3) random draw.

High Point Category Classes:

Reining Overall: 1, 2, 3 (Highest single score)

Halter (English/Western): 48, 49, 50

Leadline (English/Western): 53, 54, 55

English 10 & under: 34, 38

English 17 & under: 35, 39, 42, 45

English 18 & over/AA: 36, 40, 43, 46

English Open: 37, 41, 44, 47

Western 10 & under: 6, 10, 57

Western 17 & under: 7, 11, 14, 17, 58, 61

Western 18 & over/AA: 8, 12, 15, 18, 59, 62

Western Open: 9, 13, 16, 19, 60, 63

Ranch 17 & under: 22, 25, 28, 31, 65, 68

Ranch 18 & over/AA: 23, 26, 29, 32, 66, 69

Ranch Open: 24, 27, 30, 33, 67, 70

Judge's decisions are final. Do not approach the judge without permission from management.

Exhibitor numbers are assigned to the horse and rider/handler combination. They must be visible and displayed on your back or both sides of the saddle. Switching of numbers or horses are grounds for disqualification.

Food and beverages are available on site

Please keep show grounds clean. Pick up your trash. Deposit manure in the collection points. Do not place manure in garbage cans.

Gate calls will be enforced. No refunds for missed classes. For tack changes, let the ring steward or announcer know at least 1 class ahead of time. Use the in and out gates in a timely manner. Classes will pre-load.

Management reserves the right to combine, split or cancel classes as necessary. If you intend to add or drop classes, leave an open check.

NO REFUNDS, unless the horse or rider/handler is sick or injured. You must submit a Vet or Dr's certificate to management up to five days (postmarked) from the date of the show.

No Rain Date. Show will go on in the rain at management's discretion. All monies will be refunded if the show is cancelled.

All dogs must be on leash. No alcohol consumption allowed on fairgrounds property. No personal bar-b-ques.
